Ranking Methodology

Elementary Schools : Each OUSD elementary school was assigned a rank among elementary schools based on 2009-10 data about their Latino male students on each of five indicators:

- The percentage of Latino males proficient or higher on the English Language Arts California Standards test (Achievement Gap)
- The percentage of Latino males proficient or higher on the Math California Standards test (Achievement Gap)
- The percentage of Latino males students suspended once or more (Suspension)
- The percentage of Latino males who were chronically absent (defined as missing more than 10 percent of school days) (Attendance)
- The percentage of Latino male 4th graders proficient or higher on the English Language Arts California Standards test (Literacy)

In every case, a rank of 1 corresponds to the best performance. For example, the school with the highest percentage of Latino males students proficient or higher in math was assigned a rank of 1, likewise the school with the lowest suspension rate for Latino males was assigned a rank of 1. If more than one school had the same value on a measure (e.g. the same percentage of students suspended), those schools were assigned the same rank.

The composite rank was calculated by adding each school's rank on each measure and dividing this number by the number of measures available for that school. In this case, too, a rank of 1 indicates the best performance. Schools with fewer than 20 Latino male students were excluded from ranking.

Middle Schools : Each middle school was assigned a rank among middle schools based on 2009-10 data about their Latino male students on the above indicators, with the exception of 4th-grade literacy. The composite rank was calculated by adding each school's rank on each measure, and dividing by the number of measures. In this case, too, a rank of 1 indicates the best performance. Schools with fewer than 20 Latino males students were excluded from ranking.

High Schools : Each high school was assigned a rank among high schools based on the most recent available data about their Latino males students on the following indicators:

- The percentage of Latino males proficient or higher on the 2009-10 English Language Arts California Standards test (Achievement Gap)
- The percentage of Latino males proficient or higher on the 2009-10 Math California Standards test (Achievement Gap)
- The percentage of Latino males students suspended once or more in 2009-10 (Suspension)
- The percentage of Latino males who were chronically absent (defined as missing at least 10 percent of school days) in 2009-10 (Attendance)
- The Latino males graduation rate in 2008-09 for schools with at least 5 Latino males students, using the National Center for Education Statistics graduation rate formula (Graduation)

A composite rank was calculated by adding each school's rank on each measure, and dividing by the number of measures available for that school. In this case, too, a rank of 1 indicates the best performance. Schools with fewer than 20 Latino males students were excluded from ranking.

Limitations of These Rankings

Use caution in drawing conclusions based on these rankings. The limitations of these rankings include:

- The number of Latino male students in each school varies widely, so some ranks are based on small numbers of students.
- These rankings are based on a limited set of indicators that capture key information, but these measures do not reflect every area of the well being of Latino male students. For example, a school's ability to increase Latino males student achievement over time is not included here.
- Graduation rate data are from 2008-09, not 2009-10
- Many contextual factors influence outcomes like chronic absence and academic achievement (e.g. poverty, neighborhood safety, and students' chronic health conditions). These rankings do not take those factors into account.

The best use of these rankings is to spur further inquiry.
